

# Uniform and Dress Code at Dunottar



Years 7-11

- Outdoor coats should be plain, navy or black, and must be longer than the blazer. Leather jackets are not allowed.
- Coats are only to be worn before school, at break times and after school and must be removed before returning to lessons.
- Hair should be neat, clean and tidy and of a natural colour. Hair that is shoulder length or longer should be worn tied back with a blue or black hair tie.
- Fringes should be above the eyebrows or held in place, off the face, with a plain black or blue hair clip or band. Short hair should be long enough so that the scalp is not visible, and we would recommend that it be no shorter than grade 3. "Skin-fades" or shaved-in designs are not acceptable.
- Boys should be clean shaven at all times.
- Earrings are permitted for pupils who may wear one plain gold or silver stud earring in the lobe of each ear, but must be removed for sport. No additional piercings are allowed.
- We understand the importance of symbolic items to some people based on religion and culture and are keen that this can be accommodated through discussion with the Head of Year.
- A watch may be worn but must be removed for PE, in the interests of safety.
- Book bags must be black or navy.
- Ties should be worn to the waist and the top button of shirts should always be done up.
- Skirts must be no more than 10cm above the knee when seated (i.e. knee length).
- No make-up or nail polish should be worn.
- Shoes must be formal black shoes. Black trainer type shoes like the ones pictured are not permitted.
- Pupils may need to wear alternative footwear for medical reasons, but, in these instances, appropriate medical documentation should be passed on to the relevant Head of Year.



We expect all pupils to take pride in their appearance to ensure that they are wearing the correct uniform at all times. It is at the discretion of the Deputy Head (Pastoral) and Heads of Year as to whether non-school uniform items are allowed. The Dunottar uniform can be purchased via our online supplier, Schoolblazer ([www.schoolblazer.com](http://www.schoolblazer.com)). All items of school uniform and equipment must be clearly named (Schoolblazer offers a naming service).



## Equipment

It is useful for all pupils to have the following equipment. Please ensure that all belongings are clearly marked with your child's name.

- Casio FX83 GTPLUS scientific calculator
- A well-stocked pencil case including a pair of compasses, see-through protractor and 30cm ruler
- A small pair of headphones
- In Year 9, students are required to have a ring file for each science subject

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Smart trousers, dress, skirt or suit</li> <li>• Smart shirt or blouse, fitted jumper or top with short / long sleeves</li> <li>• Smart shirt / polo shirt and formal jumper / 1/4 zip jumper</li> <li>• Smart shoes or boots (loafers or single/subtle colour fashion style sneakers (no sports trainers/Air Force Ones)</li> <li>• Jackets (and ties for boys) required for assemblies and formal occasions</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Earrings should be studs or small hoops</li> <li>• No facial piercings unless for cultural or religious reasons</li> <li>• Dress and skirt length should be closer to the knee than to the hip (tailored, no t-shirt/ jersey material)</li> <li>• No open-toed shoes e.g. flip-flops or sandals</li> <li>• No sports trainers</li> <li>• Jeans are acceptable if they are plain and of a dark colour. No fading, rips or large pockets</li> <li>• No sports shirts, large logos or branding (small logos on polo shirts or jumpers are acceptable)</li> <li>• No vest tops, low cut tops or crop tops</li> <li>• No oversized or baggy jumpers</li> </ul>
<p>The final decision about what is or is not acceptable rests with the Director and Deputy Head of Sixth Form. If a student is unsure whether a piece of clothing is acceptable or not, it should not be worn. ⇒ Pupils will need a mouthguard for rugby. Parents will need to purchase a high-grade bite and boil mouthguard, or order online using OPRO's home mould package. Alternatively, you can purchase mouthguards from sports shops, Schoolblazer (accessories), or they can be fitted by your own dentist / orthodontist. Please note it is essential that you ask for Hi-impact or Pro-impact weight. No clear or white designs are allowed.
