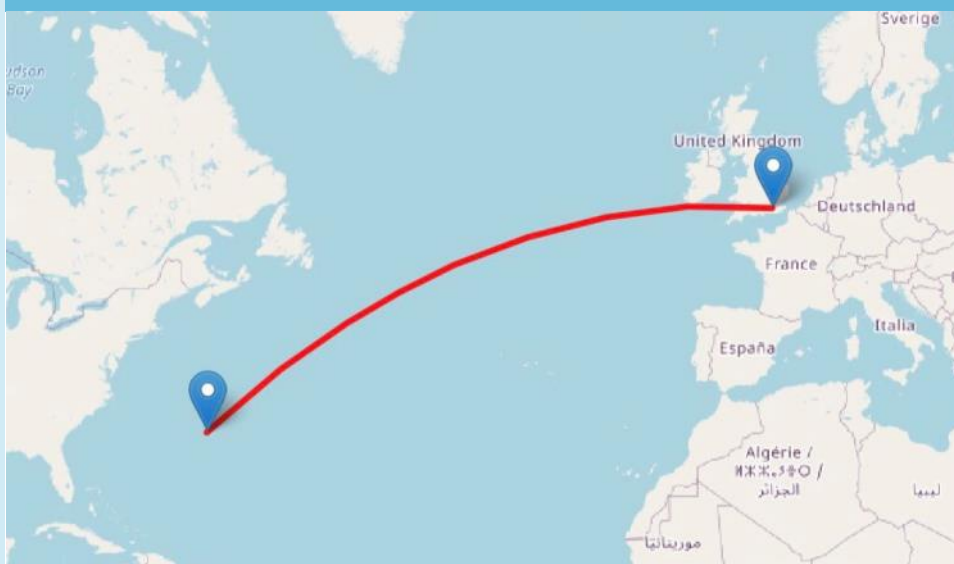

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Dunottar Tops the Table in Virtual Fixture

The United Learning Virtual Fixture took place on Saturday 16th January and once again, Dunottar topped the table for total number of miles/kilometres amassed as a community. Dunottar travelled further than a number of schools with a far larger cohort of staff and pupils on roll.

We were aiming for Dunottar School, St Lucia (6,779km), and we achieved a huge 5,272km. Given the weather, this was a great effort nonetheless. Well done to all those who got involved and helped the total.

As an entire United Learning community, comprising five competing schools, the overall distance was enough to get from London to the middle of Australia - just short of 10,000 miles.

Remote Learning Snapshot

Here are just a few examples of some of the excellent learning that has taken place this week.

Year 7 French: Les Galettes des Rois

Year 7 baked a *Galette des Rois* following a recipe in French for homework. The *Galette des Rois* ('king cake') is a dessert that is traditionally served in French households on 6th January, Epiphany, and sold in bakeries throughout the month of January. It is a central part of Christmas cuisine in France. Our pupils baked a frangipane version of the galette and went on to *tirer les rois* ('draw the kings') with their families. In this celebration, in order to ensure a random and fair distribution of the cake portions, it is traditional for the youngest person to place themselves under the table and name the recipient of each piece of the galette. The person who gets the *fève* (little charm placed inside the cake) becomes the king or the queen for the day and has to wear a crown.

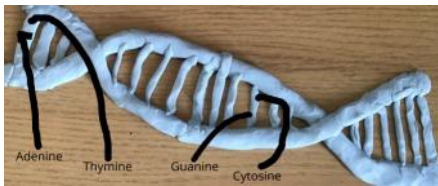


Whole School Assembly

Year 7 pupils have been learning about the structure and function of flowers. Pupils made their own modelling clay from scratch and constructed flower models.



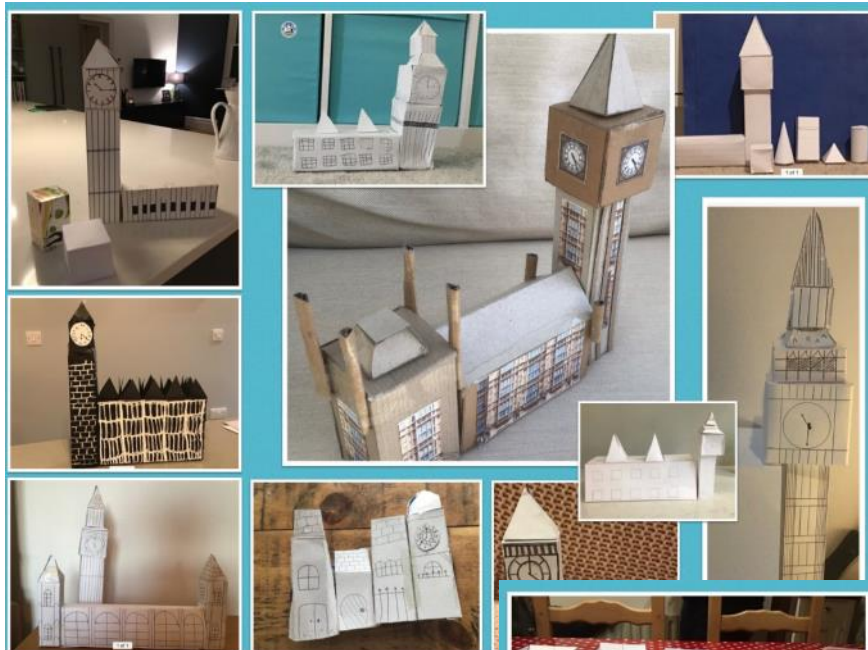
Year 7 History: The Silk Roads Title Pages



Year 7 pupils have produced these title pages as part of a new enquiry based on the silk roads.



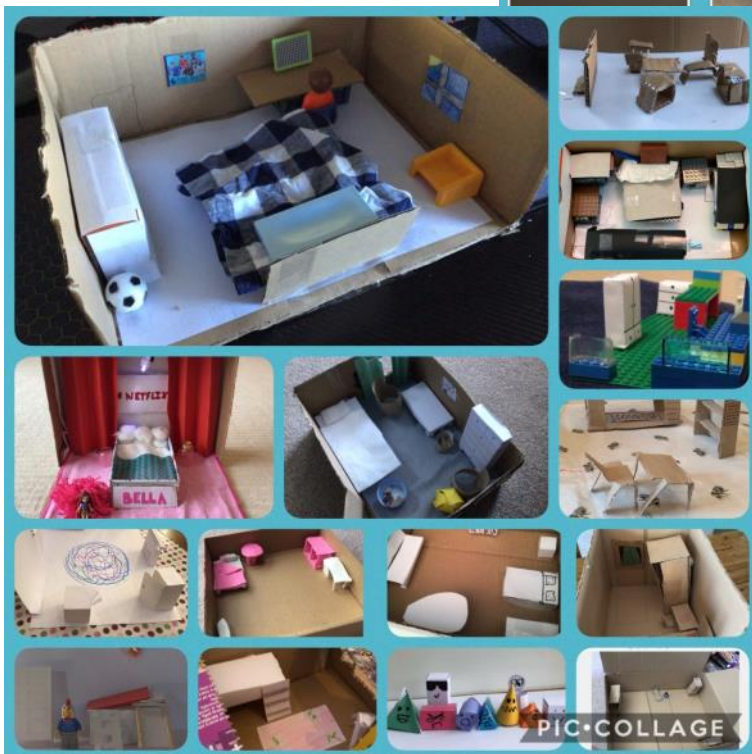
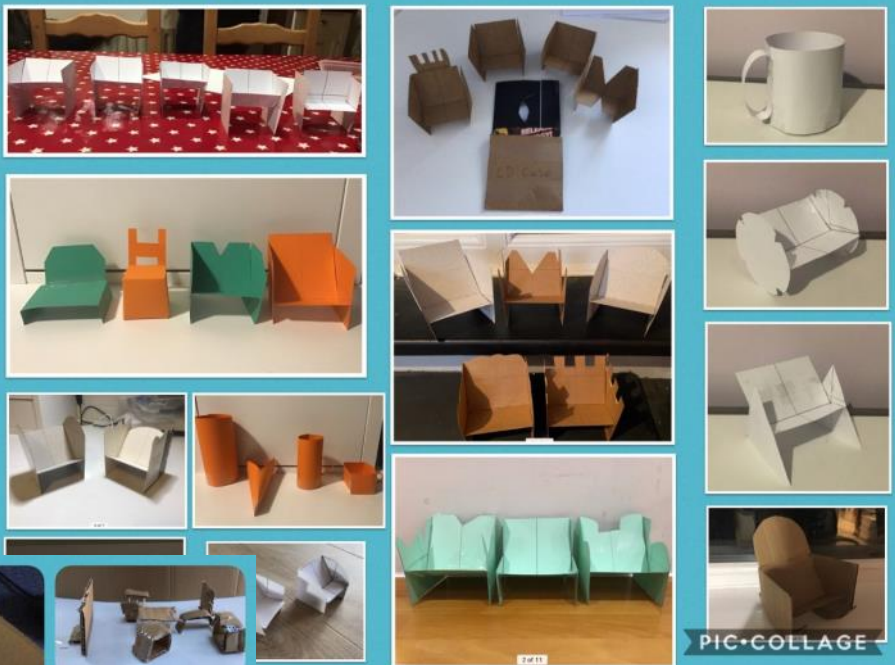
Remote Learning Snapshot

SET YOUR SPACE

EAT AND DRINK SENSIBLY

If you are worried or struggling with a piece of work, use an online tool to complete the work with classmates or contact your teacher.



GET DRESSED

Get changed out of your pyjamas into comfortable clothes to work in.



ENGAGE

Engage in live teacher contact where possible.



GET INTO A REGULAR SLEEPING PATTERN

Try and maintain some consistency with the time you go to bed and wake up.

LIMIT SCREEN TIME

Take small breaks if you have been on the computer for a long time.

STICK TO YOUR SCHOOL TIMETABLE

Planning and structuring your day will help bring a sense of routine.
